This requires multifaceted efforts in areas such as providing digital literacy training for women, taking measures against algorithms that produce discriminatory representations within AI systems, ensuring the safety and respect for fundamental rights in AI systems, securing the right of individuals to legal recourse against decisions made using AI, evaluating AI systems before and during their use, mitigating negative impacts, and preventing technology-facilitated violence against women and girls.

In this regard, the Ministry of Family and Social Services of the Republic of Türkiye conducts multi-stakeholder efforts with private sector, non-governmental organizations, and international institutions to support women and girls, particularly through education, guiding them towards STEM fields, increasing digital literacy, and promoting equality between women and men across society.

On the other hand, in addition to the efforts carried out by the Ministry of Family and Social Services, non-governmental organizations are also making significant contributions to this process through various projects and educational programs aimed at enabling women to take a more active role in society. Among these NGOs, Women and Democracy Association (KADEM), one of the non-governmental organizations aimed at empowering women and ensuring their access to rights since its establishment, plays an important role with its projects focused on increasing women's participation in education and employment.

Women and Democracy Association (KADEM), has been organizing the "Women and Justice Summit" biennially in cooperation with the Ministry of Family and Social Services of the Republic of Türkiye since 2014 with various themes.

The theme of the VI. Women and Justice Summit, organized by the Ministry of Family and Social Services of the Republic of Türkiye and KADEM, is set as "Artificial Intelligence and Women". The sixth summit aims to comprehensively discuss how the gains acquired in the age of AI can be utilized, using a holistic approach, for a more just and equal future for women. The summit will address the following key questions:

What are the positive and negative impacts of AI technologies and algorithms on women? Can advancements in AI technology offer a more just and equal future for women? Can AI create new negative social norms for women or reinforce existing ones? Alternatively, does AI have the potential to make negative social norms more inclusive and fair for women? Do the perceptions of AI developers and producers regarding equality between women and men reflect in the algorithms? How can AI be approached to ensure that women are equal participants in future technology uses? What can be done to increase female representation in AI-related fields?
